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LNG - more terminals in Europe?



Energy security remains a key priority. We forecast that European production of hydrocarbons will continue to decline, and that **more LNG import terminals will be built** to provide alternatives to piped gas from Norway and Russia.

European LNG terminals currently idle

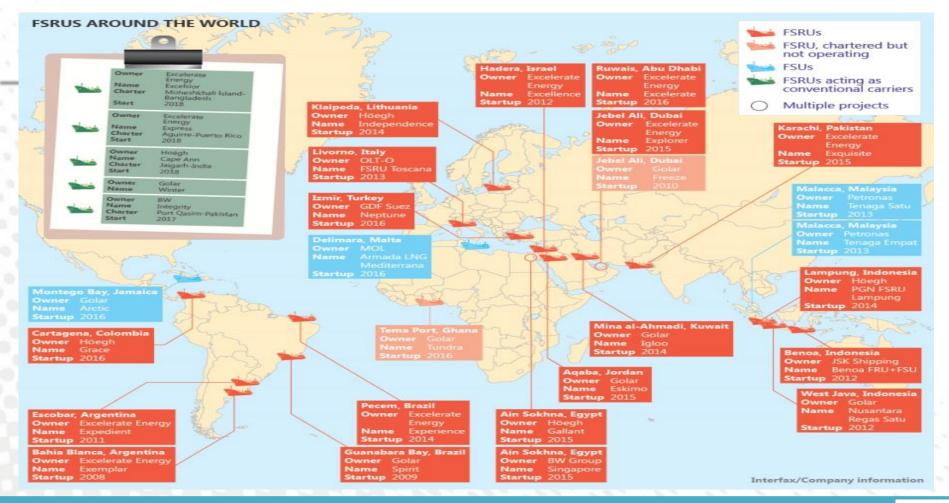
 Between 1 January and 31 August, European LNG terminals were used less than 25% of capacity, according to data published by Gas Infrastructure Europe.

The GIE data is compiled from the following LNG terminals:

- Spain: Bilbao, Barcelona, Cartagena, Huelva, Mugardos, Sagunto
- France: Dunkerque, Fos Tonkin, Montoir de Bretagne, Fos Cavaou
- Italy: Adriatic, Panigaglia, FSRU OLT Offshore LNG Toscana
- UK: Dragon, Isle of Grain, South Hook

Netherlands: Gate, Belgium: Zeebrugge, Portugal: Sines, Greece: Revythoussa, Poland: Świnoujście, Lithuania: FSRU Independence (Klaipeda)
